

Sanctioning Guidelines: 2009-2010

Fairness and consistency are essential features of the student conduct process. The Sanctioning Guidelines serve as a mechanism to ensure that students who are found responsible for similar acts of misconduct are given comparable consequences. Student conduct administrators and student conduct boards should rely on these guidelines when selecting sanctions.

The sanctions listed in this document are not meant to be mandates; however, when adjusting sanctions, student conduct administrators and student conduct boards must provide a clear and definitive rationale as to why a particular sanction was increased or reduced. This rationale should be based on the student's actions and may not be based on the administrator or board feeling that the guidelines are too harsh or lenient. When considering alternative sanctions, student conduct administrators and student conduct boards may consult with staff in the Office of Student Conduct.
